

STAGE MAKEUP TRAINING NOTES

Prep:

- Start with a clean, exfoliated face.
- Avoid excessive moisturizer (use only a small amount if necessary).
- For sweaty faces, prep with oil control. (ex. Skin Prep Pro.)

Eyes:

- Start with eyes, as mistakes & eye shadow powders can marr foundation.
- Eye Primer - use a fluffy brush. Primer keeps shadow dry & clear. Eyelids are quite oily.
- Base - use flat brush or concealer brush. Always use a white base. Pat it on and gently blend. Start at the lash line in the middle and blend up. Pull the base all the way to the brow line.
- Shadow - matte shows up better than shimmer. Have a matte black, matte white and matte color to match the dress.
- Eye pencil - good black urban decay in 24/7 waterproof
- Mascara - avoid waterproof.
- Use a small brush to apply the matte color in a rainbow shape just above the arch. Touch the outside first and pull it into the center.
- Use brush with white matte for blending.
- Use pencil brush with matte black to create an arched line underneath the rainbow. Start at the outside and move in
- Eyeliner - create a very light line, starting in the outer corner make a short dash. Taper it in to the center.
- Use white matte on the outside edge of color and also underneath the black eyeliner around the bottom of the eye.
- Use a towelette to clean underneath the eyes and cheeks. Press down from the corner to create a defined line. Coconut oil and olive oil are also great natural alternatives for makeup removal.

Face:

- Apply primer in T-Zone and blend out - typically the oily or red areas.
- Lightly apply concealer (not foundation) with a round fluffy brush.
- Focus darker color on the outside ring of the face.
- Blend well - Pull makeup down onto the neck
- Blush - depending on face structure, focus on the apples of the cheeks and a little above.
- Blush highlighter - a warm bronzer

- Contour - cooler/grayer on hollow areas, pull from hairline forward. Apply under the chin, pull along the jawbone and up to each ear.
- Highlight - use a lighter white color (either matte or shimmer) on top of blush up the cheekbone and just above.

Lashes:

- The last step!
- Ensure that fake lashes are the same length as your own, or a bit shorter - you may need to trim them using scissors or tweezers.
- Use lash adhesive
- To apply glue: point the bottle up and pop out a small bubble of adhesive. Run a tiny strip of adhesive along the lash line.
- Wait for the adhesive to dry a little and become tacky
- Press the middle of the the fake lashes down first. Then attach the ends.
- Clean up liner if necessary

Lips:

- Sephora lip gloss in center
- Lip stains optional (less chance of sticking to hair)
- Frame the outside of the lip first with liner. Then color in the rest.

Brush Care:

- Get good ones - they are tools and make a great deal of difference
- Use brush cleaner and a towel to wipe off the brushes between products
- Wash with warm water and soap between uses.
- Store flat.
